

Open Photoshop

Re-open the file “Layer Exercise 1”

Save As “Layer Exercise 2”

Make sure the Layer’s Palette is open.

Click and drag the Triangle layer, dropping it underneath the Circle layer

Change the “Opacity” of the Triangle layer to 35%, located at the top of the Layer’s palette

Change the “Opacity” of the Square layer to 60%

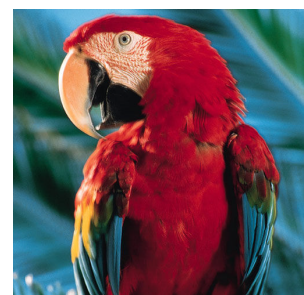
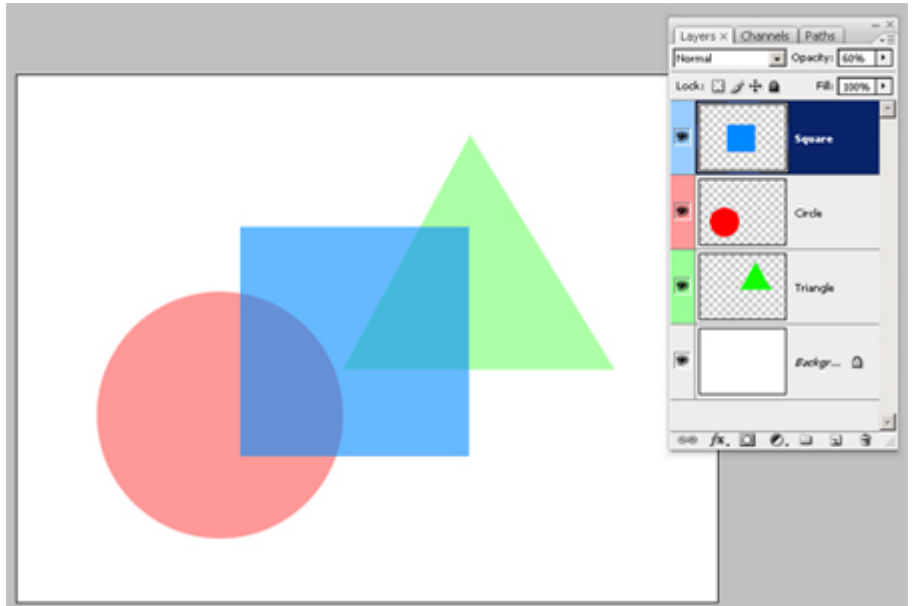
Change the Opacity of the Circle layer to 40%

Go to

<http://www.damagekontrol.com> and click on the Home/Resources button and then select the “Source Files” tab.

On this page, you will find three hyperlinks labeled “Dog,” “Cat,” and “Bird”. Clicking on these links will open up images of a Dog, Cat, and Bird. You need to download these images onto your student folder.



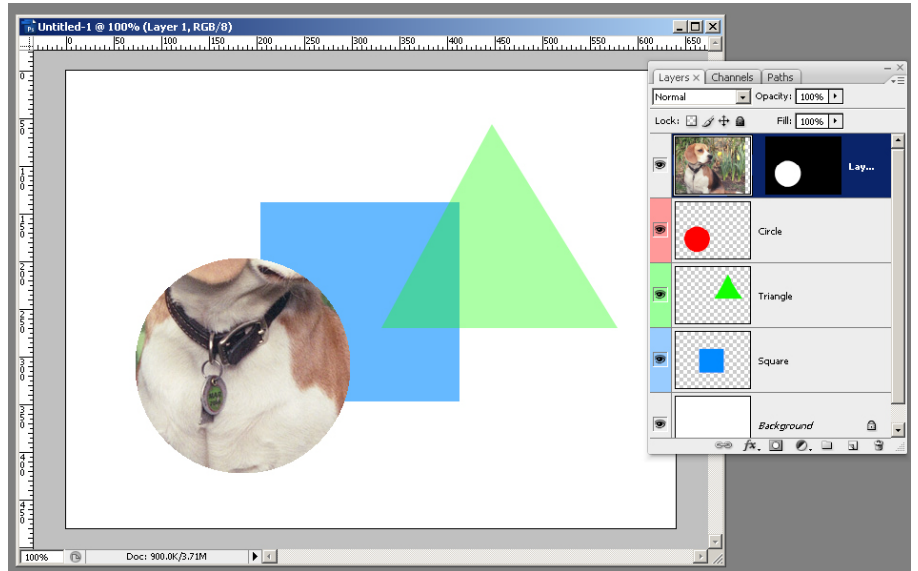
In Photoshop, open up the “Dog” file.

Click on the “Select” menu and choose “Select All”. This will select the entire picture of the dog.

Copy the picture of the dog

Close the picture of the dog

On your Layer’s Exercise 2 Photoshop file, use the Magic Wand to select the Circle (You must select the Circle layer first)

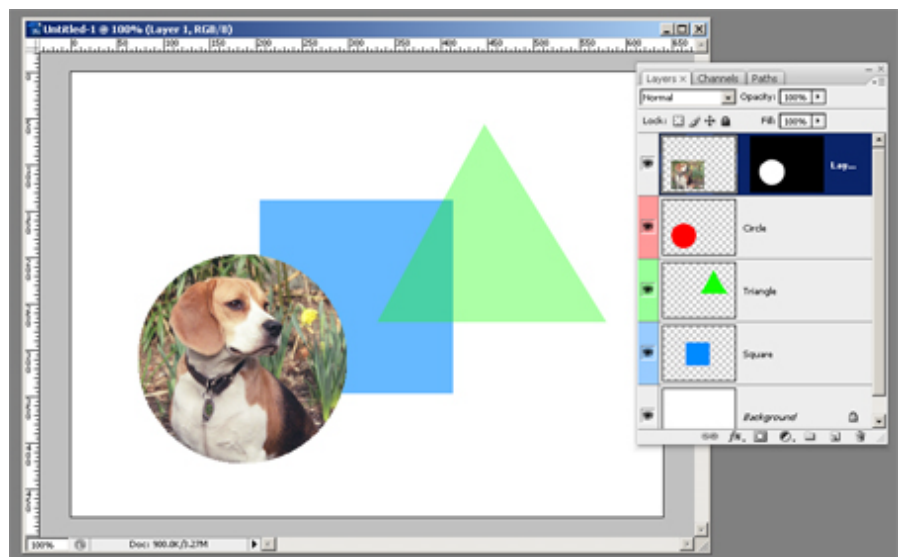


With the Circle “Marquee’d” off, go to the menu item labeled “Edit” and then “Paste Into”. This will paste the picture of the dog in the circle.

Notice the new layer on the Layer’s Palette. You can see the layer with the dog as well as a white circle to the right of it. This is a Layer Mask. The mask allows whatever is in the circle to show through. Whatever is behind the black part of the mask is hidden from view.

Name this layer “Dog”

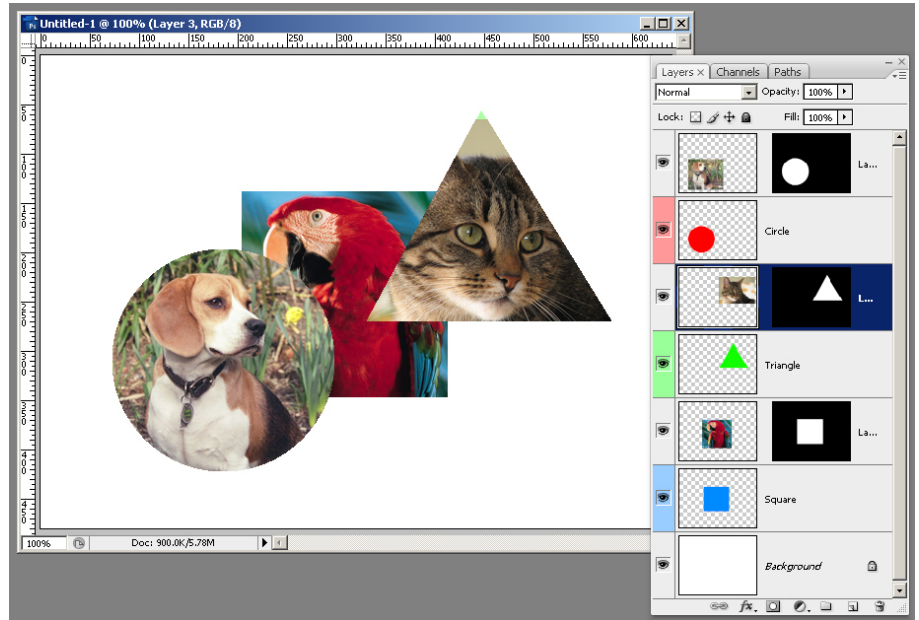
The dog appears to be too large. You need to rescale the picture of the dog by clicking on the menu item “Edit” then click the drop-down item labeled “Transform”. Select “Scale” from the Transform menu.



Hold down the “Shift” key, grab any of the corners on the rescaling box and drag inward towards the center of the picture. This will scale the image down so that it fits within the circle.

You can also grab the picture and move it around for a better fit as well.

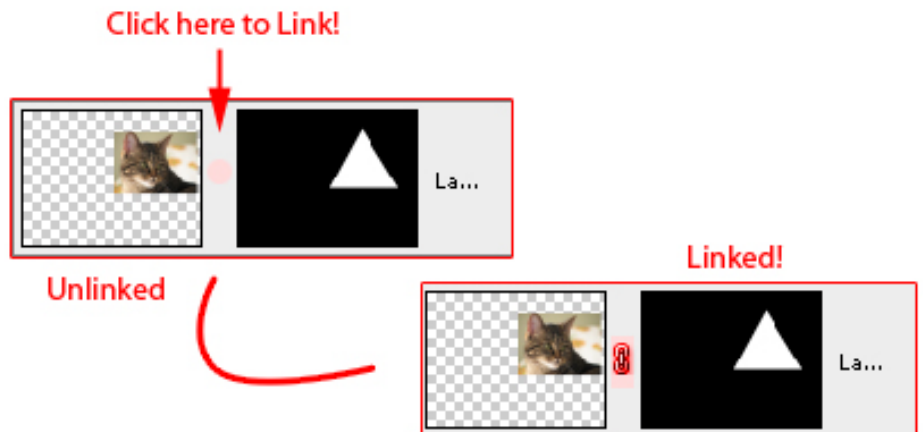
When you are done, click the “Return” key. This finishes up the Transform function.



Repeat the process with the picture of the Bird and the Cat. The provided sample shows how your image should look when you are done.

Remember to name these layers “Bird” and “Cat”

The layers and their masks must be “linked”. Click on the little gap between the image and the mask on the layer. After you click, you will notice a small chain link symbol.



Now, it's time to link the layers.

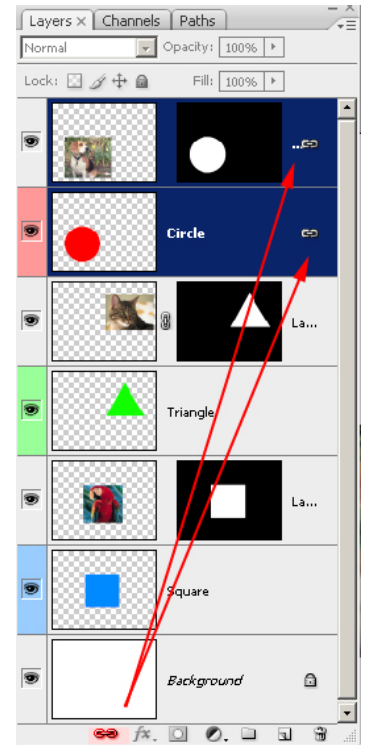
Click on the Dog layer, hold down the "Shift" key, and then click on the "Circle" layer. This allows you to select multiple layers at one time.

Click on the "Link" button at the bottom of the Layer's Palette. This will link multiple layers together.

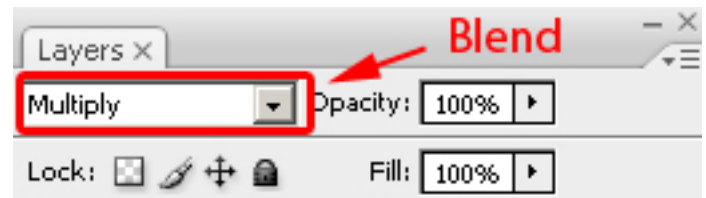
Remember to do this for the Cat and Bird as well.

Now, reposition the cat towards the bottom right hand corner of the document.

Reposition the dog to the upper left hand corner of the document.



Click on the Dog layer and change its blend mode to "Multiply" (at the top of the Layers Palette).



Click on the Cat layer and change its blend to "Exclusion"

Click on the Bird layer and change it's blend to "Vivid Light"

Save
